My dear Mr. Lehlbach:

Your letter of May 1st with enclosures in the case of Private Axel Enholm, whose release from the Marine Corps is desired, has been referred to me by the Secretary of the Navy.

In reply I regret to inform you that I am unable to take any action in the matter at this time. The law provides for the granting of furlough without pay and allowances for the unexpired portion of an enlistment, but this privilege can only be extended when the efficiency of the service will not be impaired. The present emergency has made it necessary to indefinitely suspend the granting of such furloughs, and as this would be the only action I could ordinarily take in a case of this kind I am unable to comply with your request.



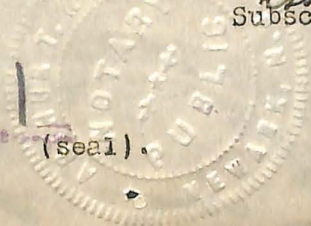
